First of all, I would like to thank AEUA (Arab European Universities Association) and Groningen University for this kind invitation. Built on the Kingdom's Red Sea coast, not far from Jiddah, KAUST will be an international, graduate research university designed to inspire a new age of scientific achievement and knowledge creation in Saudi Arabia, the Middle East region, and indeed the world. It has brought together faculty, staff and students from throughout the Kingdom and around the globe, allowing these talented men and women to learn, explore and discover, in state-of-the-art facilities, using the resources of a world-class institution.

Partnership with other leading universities and research institutions is also an integral part of Aramco's vision. The company has a long history of University Collaboration and this program, which is driven by our desire to expand the domestic university knowledge pool in support of our Research and Development Center, has been expanded to Europe, North America and the Far East. Each year, through these collaborative ventures, Saudi Aramco also selects high potential talented students from Saudi Arabia to pursue Bachelor's, Master's and PhDs at top overseas universities.

At this moment we have 430 highly talented and careful selected Saudi Aramco sponsored students studying in the UK and Continental Europe. These countries are the UK, Ireland, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland, the Netherlands, France, Spain and Italy.

Many other Saudi Aramco sponsored students are also studying in North America, Australia and Far East countries, such as China and Japan. We believe these students will benefit from the most advanced education throughout the world, and also foster mutual understanding between cultures and nations, both within and alongside the company. It is our enduring goal to continue and expand our collaborative programs with leading Universities worldwide.

Aramco Overseas Company, here in the Netherlands, has been heavily involved in a number of different educational projects over the years, working with universities throughout Europe and the Far East, including sponsorship of academic visits to Saudi Arabia.

In fact last year, we arranged for academics from top European universities to visit the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, to learn more about the country and to participate in an exchange of knowledge and ideas with their counterparts at our own Research and



Development Center. This year, we are planning another visit with a broader scope, involving participation by more universities in Europe and the Far East.

An equally important part of our educational program is the continued development of our employees. The company provides extensive professional development program for our employees. Today, the company maintains one of the largest and most extensive corporate training programs, ranging from traditional classroom training to online learning modules, structured mentoring, and institutional support for self-development initiatives. Much has changed in the world of petroleum, but for all the new technology and more sophisticated infrastructure and operations, one thing that remains the same is the criticality of the professionals that work in this industry, who still represent the most significant differentiating factor among energy companies.
